Excerpt from the 2017-18 Code of Conduct

- 2. Make every effort to successfully complete the requirements in order to develop capabilities.
- 3. Respect the individual rights and property of self/others.

- Respect individual differences.
- 6. Facilitate communication between home and school.
- 7. Be aware of rights, procedures and consequences.

Dignity for All Students Act

Effective date: July 1, 2012

New York State's Dignity for All Students Act (DASA/The Dignity Act) seeks to provide the State's public elementary and secondary school students with a safe and supportive environment, free from discrimination, intimidation, taunting, harassment and bullying on school property, a school bus and/or at a school function.

This legislation amended the State Education Law by creating a new Article 2-Dignity for All Students. The Dignity Act also amended Section 801-a of New York State Education Law regarding instruction in civility, citizenship, and character education by expanding the concepts of tolerance, respect for others and dignity to include: an awareness and sensitivity in the relations of people, including but not limited to, different races, weights, national origins, ethnic groups, religious practices, mental or physical abilities, sexual orientations, gender identity, and sexes. The Dignity Act further amended Section 2801 of the Education Law by requiring Boards of Education to include language addressing The Dignity Act in their codes of conduct.

A DASA liaison has been assigned to every district building. Additional information can be found on our website.

Budget Referendum & Trustee Vote

The election of members to the Board of Education is held at the same time as the annual vote on the school district budget.

The date is May 15, 2018; hours are 12 p.m. to 9 p.m. Candidates for Board seats must have been residents of the school district for at least one year prior to the election. They must be 18 years of age, U.S. citizens, qualified voters and able to read and write. Prospective candidates must file nominating petitions with the District Clerk.

Voter Qualifications

To vote, persons must be U.S. citizens, 18 years of age, and residents of the school district for 30 days prior to the vote. Apartment dwellers are permitted to vote. There is no preregistration process. Identification will be required. The preferable forms are a Board of Elections card, driver's license, postmarked mail, rental/lease receipt, a non-driver identification card or a utility bill.
